

RESOLUTION NO. 13-136

**WHEREAS**, the City Council and Mayor of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, are pleased to honor Dr. Ann Roy Moore, during Black History Month, 2013. She was the first African American Deputy Superintendent of Huntsville City Schools and the first African American Superintendent of Huntsville City Schools. Dr. Moore was also the first African American Manager of Elementary Education in the City; and,

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Moore provided leadership state wide through her work with the Governor's Commission on School Leadership, chairing numerous State Department of Education committees, and her leadership among superintendents was demonstrated by her active service on the SSA Executive Committee and chairing the Professional Development Committee; and,

**WHEREAS**, her educational and professional training include: Alabama A&M University, Normal, Alabama, K-12 Superintendency, 1992; Class AA Certification, Educational Administration, 1987; Class A Certification, Educational Administration, 1986; George Peabody College of Vanderbilt University, Nashville, Tennessee, Ed.D., Curriculum Leadership Personnel and Early Childhood Education, 1986; University of North Alabama, Florence, Alabama, Ed.S., Elementary Education, 1976, M.A., Elementary Education, 1975; and Hampton University, Hampton, Virginia, B.S., Early Childhood Education, 1972; and,

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Ann Roy Moore served as the Superintendent of Huntsville City Schools, Huntsville, Alabama (June 2001 - 2010). She served in the following positions in the educational field in the North Alabama area: Deputy Superintendent, Huntsville City Schools, Huntsville, Alabama (March 1999 - May 2001); Assistant Superintendent, Florence City Schools, Florence, Alabama (1992-March 1999); Adjunct Professor of Education, Alabama A&M University, Normal, Alabama, Athens State College, Athens, Alabama, Shoals Community College, Muscle Shoals, Alabama, and University of North Alabama, Florence, Alabama; Manager - Elementary Education, Huntsville City Schools, Huntsville, Alabama (1989-1992); Principal, Terry Heights Elementary School, Huntsville, Alabama (1986-1989); and Kindergarten Teacher, Roger Chaffee Elementary School, Huntsville, Alabama (1980-1986); and,

**WHEREAS**, she was known as a tireless representative for Huntsville City Schools and an exemplary community leader. She was insightful, intelligent, ethical, compassionate, caring, a visionary, passionate about educating youth, an inspirational role model and always professional. As a leader in the community, Dr. Moore received numerous awards including the Rotary Vocational Excellence Award given annually to a Rotarian who excelled in their profession and exhibited honesty and integrity. Some of her other professional memberships

include: American Association of School Administrators, School Superintendents of Alabama, National Affiliate; Council for Leaders in Alabama; the National Alliance of Black School Educators; and the National School Public Relations Association. She was very active in the School Superintendents of Alabama and served on the SSA Board of Directors as District President for two terms and as state secretary for approximately three years. During her tenure as secretary, she served on the Executive Committee and provided leadership for the direction of the association and the state wide work of superintendents to influence policy at both the state department and the legislature. She was selected Alabama's 2008 Superintendent of the Year by the School Superintendents of Alabama.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council and Mayor of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, wish to recognize Dr. Ann Roy Moore, not only for her work in the Huntsville City Schools but for being the first African American in the positions she held in the City School System. Dr. Moore's colleagues hold her in the highest regard locally and across the state, and she is very deserving to be honored during Black History Month, 2013.
