WHEREAS, Dr. Littlepage has more than 39 years of experience in the Department of the Army's planning, programming, budgeting, execution, justification and defense of aviation and missile complex weapon systems, ground support and sustainment. This includes 30 years at the U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Life-Cycle Management Command (AMCOM) Resource Management; four years at PERSHING PMO and Weapons Systems Management; and five years in Logistics Management including the deployment and sustainment of the Logistics Modernization Program (LMP) and LMP sustainment training; and,

WHEREAS, her federal service began as an engineering aide 1969 and 1970 at the Mobile District Corps of Engineers, and as a clerk stenographer in 1973 at the Atomic Energy Commission, Oakridge, Tennessee. In July of 1974, she became an Army Materiel Command Budget Analyst Intern with the U.S. Army Missile Command (MICOM) and graduated that program in August, 1977. Aggressively developing as a Journeyman Budget Analyst, she began her stellar career and became a Senior Budget Analyst in October, 1979. Dr. Littlepage will conclude her federal career May 3, 2013, as Deputy Director, Business Management Directorate (BMD), AMCOM Logistics Center (ALC) where she has responsibility and oversight of Resource Management (financial, personnel programs, and automation); Professional Development; and Contracts Management for LMP Sustainment Resources and Training for the Army Materiel Command, ALC, AMCOM, Corpus Christi and Letterkenny Army Depots; and,

WHEREAS, Dr. Littlepage graduated from Jackson State University in 2011, with a Ph.D. in Urban Higher Education and Leadership. In 1974, she earned her B.S. Business Education from Alabama A&M University in Huntsville, and her Master of Business Administration in 1980 from Alabama A&M; and,

WHEREAS, she is a Certified Defense Financial Manager and a Certified Government Financial Manager. She completed all training requirements for Level IV Certification in Comptrollership, Level III Certified in Business, Cost Estimating, and Financial Management. Awards and honors bestowed on Dr. Littlepage are numerous and include the William Hooper Council Distinguished Alumni; Rosa Parks Woman of Courage; Commander's Award for Civilian Service; Zeta of the Year; Achievement Medal for Civilian Service; American Society of Military Comptrollers Budget Award; and Alabama A&M University Presidential Alumni Award; and,
