WHEREAS, the City Council and the Mayor of the City of Huntsville, Alabama are apprised that Raymond Navorra “Uncle Red” Glover will be celebrating his 95th birthday on August 1, 2015, at Fellowship Presbyterian Church in Huntsville; and,

WHEREAS, Raymond Glover attended private and public schools in Anniston, Alabama, where he later became the first milkman of color. He is a graduate of Morris Brown College, Atlanta, Georgia, where he received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in History; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Glover served in the U.S. Army Quarter Master Corps from 1945 to 1946, acquiring the rank of Supply Sergeant. This division supplied soldiers with food, clothing, and other supplies during World War II; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Glover taught high school Social Studies in Talladega, Cleburne, and Calhoun Counties for 18 years, and was the first Black Professional to serve in the Calhoun County juvenile court system as a probation officer, retiring in 1982; and,

WHEREAS, Raymond Glover was an ordained Deacon of 17th Street Baptist Church, where served as Director of Senior Choir and as an Adult Sunday School Teacher. He is a lifetime member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., and in 2002, received his 50 Year Membership Pin. He organized the Anniston-Piedmont Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity; and,

WHEREAS, Raymond Glover was a lifelong resident of 1811 Cooper Avenue until July 2007, when he became a resident of Floyd E. Tut Fann Veterans Home, where he is active in many social activities.
