Why Implement CIT?

- HPD constantly assesses its operations and creates plans for improvement
- In 2017, HPD recognized that the mental health crisis in our community was increasing, and officers were routinely facing it with limited knowledge and resources
- HPD answers over 1000 calls per year that deals with some type of mental health crisis
- HPD fully implemented the CIT Program in 2018

"CIT" What is it?

CIT programs create connections between law enforcement, mental health providers, hospital emergency services and individuals with mental illness and their families. Through collaborative community partnerships and intensive training, CIT improves communication, identifies mental health resources for those in crisis, and helps to ensure officer and community safety.
